### Shaolin ex-monk

There's a renegade monk on the loose... he's a master of the six hand style, has robbed eighteen banks, killed twenty people... and only Sherrif Lin's 'Seven Immovable Limbs' can stop him! John Liu in high kicking form plays the sherrif who has tracked the evil monk down to a small town and enlists the help of Shao Lee Chin (an orphan with an appalling haircut) whom he teaches Kung Fu.... but the Shaolin ex-monk has other plans and will murder anyone in his way to remain undetected. With a plot somewhere between Agatha Christie and Sergio Leone, 'Shaolin ex-monk' delivers a full complement of intrigue, mystery and plentiful fighting action. With Ko Shou Liang and Hwang Hsiang Shaw.

### When Taekwondo strikes

"Here comes a unique and devastating force: Taekwando! A very lethal form of Kung Fu! Jhoon Rhee: he's called the father of Taekwando in America. See why five million Americans worship this amazing grand master! When Taekwando strikes! See this shocking saga of rebellion and revenge! Angela Mao: She's the renowned deadly china doll with deadly kicks! When Taekwando strikes! Raymond Chow is the world's action producer! He's got exactly what you want... and he outdoes himself in: When Taekwando strikes! Angela Mao: She's clever! and she fights to kill! Taekwando! Those who use it take command... those who don't...DIE!".....So goes the trailer... need we say more?

### The Invincible Armour

Accused of the murder of Lu, minister of War, General Chiao escapes his guard and embarks on a quest to find the real killer. However, the assassin is not only a master of the Eagle Claw- the deadliest known form of kung-fu- but also has learned the technique of the Invincible Armour. It is up to Chiao to find the assassin's one weak spot: his breath-hole. But is it in his forehead, his chest or in his testicles? Starring John Lau- the master of all kicking techniques.



### Fist of Vengeance

The Chinese resistance capture important military documents from a downed Japanese plane. But it won't be easy to smuggle them back to HQ, because Japanese intelligence are killing anyone in their way to get them back.



### Shaolin vs Lama

(starring Lo Jui and Chang Shan ). Han wanders China searching for a form of kung fu superior to his own. This leads him to the Buddhist monastery of Shaolin, where he gets sucked into the ongoing battle between the Shaolin and the Tibetan Lamas. Has Han learnt kung fu well enough to defeat the evil lama gang? (This film received 4 fists out of 5 in The Essential Guide to Hong Kong Movies by Rick Baker.)

### The One-Armed Boxer

After his right arm is sliced off by a demonic Karate master, Jimmy wang yu is left for dead by the man who has already killed all his friends and controls an army of killers from all over the world. He survives with the help of a mystical old man who makes his remaining arm hard as iron with a secret process. Now it's time for revenge- but can the one armed boxer fight his way past the Indian yogi, Thai kickboxers, Tibetan monks, and the man who cut his arm off?

### Shaolin challenges Ninja

Just your average story: boy meets girl, they get married. But the girl, Kuda, is Japanese and has nothing but contempt for Chinese martial arts. And the boy, Ah Tou, is Chinese and a kung fu student not about to tolerate such insults. One fight leads to another, and before you know it, the masters of each of Japan's martial arts have challenged Ah-Tou, and there's only one style he can use to save his marriage, his life and the reputation of Chinese martial arts: Drunken God. With Gordon Liu Chia-Hui, the star of The 36th Chamber of Shaolin and Dirty Ho.



### Karate Ghostbuster

There's something strange going on at the Shaolin monastery: a ninja has stolen the Book of the Seven Fists, and Lung and the other novices are falling victim to weird and impossible pranks. Whilst the chief monks worry about who has the stolen book, which describes a kung fu style second in invincibility only to the lost style of the Five Fists, Lung tries to pin down the pranksters. Meanwhile, the Seven Fists style is being used to ruthlessly eliminate all competitors for the title of all-kungfu-sect leader and only Lung's new-found skills might stop the evil plot succeeding.

### The Eight Masters

When Shao Chi is killed by the Eight Masters his only son is rescued and brought up by the monks of the Shaolin Temple, who teach him to practice both non violence and how to kick the shit out of anyone. After a gruelling test involving four gold robots whom he must fight on a huge gold swastika covered in spikes, young Chi is allowed to leave the temple- but the eight masters have learned of his existence and will stop at nothing to provoke him into a fight. 'The Eight Masters' is a revenge classic with a spectacular finale as Chi fights his way to victory in eight violent stages.

### Ninja Hunter

The master of the Wu Tang faces the top pupil of Shaolin on a mountain top and is beaten for daring to suggest that the Wu Tang is superior. In a fit of vengeance, he recruits an army of Ninjas to destroy the Shaolin temple once and for all... Ninja Hunter brings new meaning to the phrase 'Non-Stop Action' as the Shaolin monks must defend their very existence against an onslaught of black, white and gold ninjas and perhaps the most dangerous of all- the Wu Tang grand master himself. ### One armed boxer versus the Flying Guillotine

Feng's an assassin, a blind master of the Flying Guillotine which can remove your head with a simple flick of the wrist. His two proteges were defeated and killed by the One Armed Boxer, Jimmy Wang Yu - and Feng has every intention to take Jimmy's head in return.



### Guards of Shaolin

The Emperor's eunuch Yu Kun Kun presents the ultimatum to the Shaolin Temple: hand over the Golden Sutra or die. The Master of Shaolin refuses but is betrayed and murdered. Now it is up to four brothers to smuggle the Sutra to safety in Tibet -but they must contend with ninjas, archers, swordsmen, snowmen, zombies and killer circus clowns on the way....Not to mention their uncle who betrayed the temple in the first place. ### Super Ninjas

What starts as a contest between the Ninja school of Kang and the Kung Fu school of Chen Chun quickly descends into war. With the Chen Chun and his men murdered in a sneak attack by the ninjas, Shao Tin Hao and the remaining survivors must avenge the death of their masters. The ninjas however, are organised into five elemental groups- earth, water, fire, air and gold. Each have their special powers and each must be fought in a special way....This Shaw Brothers classic was directed by Chang Cheh, godfather of

### Fists of the white lotus

Shaolin's all-time super star and honorary monk, Gordon Liu Chia Hui once again plays the underdog as his friends, kung fu school and half his family are murdered by an evil and mysterious white eyebrowed master who has only one weak spot. Not a sequel, just a poetic way of saying 'Two Warriors'. Samo Hung & Casanova Wong show no mercy as they take on the gangsters who are trying to muscle in on the town's bank- But when evil boss Mo has his Four Swordsmen kill Wong's mother all hell breaks loose... Showcasing some of the best and most authentic Wing Chun scenes in a kung fu movie, Warriors Two combines a brilliant cast, flawless fight choreography and a spectacular finale to make 'a true Kung Fu classic' (The Essential Guide to Hong Kong Movies)

### Two crippled heroes

Chung has no arms, Fang has no legs, but the spirits of righteousness and Kung Fu burn within their breasts. In a truly staggering display of what the differently abled members of the community are capable of, the Two Crippled Heroes fight hand in foot against the Peiyan warlord and his evil henchmen while at the same time protecting a beautiful witness to the warlord's skullduggery. As well as that, they must save the good people of Fang's village and have vengeance upon the man who killed Chung's monkey. The only thing this film doesn't have is space aliens.

### Shogun Assassin

The Japanese classic that inspired the Lone Wolf TV series. Lone Wolf is the Shogun's top assassin who is spuriously accused of disloyalty and marked for death, but the Ninjas fail to kill him and instead murder his wife. So he must have vengeance upon the Shogun's brother and deal with every killer sent to stop him. Accompanying Lone wolf is his 4 year old son whom he transports in a wooden pram rigged with a deadly arsenal of weapons and who narrates the adventures of his renegade samurai father. More swordplay than kung fu, but if spurring blood's your thing, then this is the film for you.
